## SENATE BILL No. 349

AN ACT concerning health and healthcare; relating to oral health; 1 2 establishing a state oral health plan; medical assistance dental benefits; 3 revising the dental practices act; amending K.S.A. 65-1456 and 4 repealing the existing section. 5 6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:* 7 Sections 1 through 3, and amendments thereto, shall New Section 1. 8 be known and may be cited as the Kansas oral health improvement act. 9 New Sec. 2. (a) The secretary of health and environment shall 10 develop, implement and monitor a state oral health plan and, at least once 11 every five calendar years, shall prepare and publish a written report 12 detailing such plan. The plan shall address, at a minimum, the following 13 topics as related to oral health services in the state of Kansas: Oral health 14 workforce, drinking water, teledentistry, oral health literacy, the financing of oral health services and system collaboration between oral health 15 16 providers, funding sources and consumers. 17 (b) The secretary of health and environment shall convene an advisory committee consisting of public and private stakeholders to assist 18 19 the secretary in developing, implementing and monitoring the state oral 20 health plan. Members of such advisory committee shall include, but not be 21 limited to, individuals from the following organizations: 22 (1) The department of health and environment; 23 (2) oral health Kansas: 24 (3) the community care network of Kansas; 25 (4) the Kansas dental hygienists' association; and 26 (5) the Kansas dental association. 27 (c) The secretary of health and environment shall convene meetings 28 of the advisory committee at least once per calendar year, except that, in 29 the calendar year immediately preceding the written report required by 30 subsection (a), the secretary shall convene meetings of the advisory 31 committee at least once per calendar quarter. 32 (d) In the advisory committee's considerations, the secretary of health 33 and environment shall solicit input and participation from stakeholders 34 representing the following interests: Behavioral health, disabilities, aging, 35 early childhood, hospitals, public health, with emphasis on local health 36 departments, education, long-term care, dental education, insurance and

1 health foundations.

2 New Sec. 3. (a) The secretary of health and environment shall 3 establish or adjust provider reimbursement rates for dental services 4 provided to medical assistance enrollees under K.S.A. 39-709, and 5 amendments thereto, at rates equal to 60% of the reimbursement rates paid 6 by the state healthcare benefits program. The secretary shall review such 7 rates for potential adjustment at least once per calendar year.

8 (b) The secretary of health and environment shall provide dental 9 benefits to any medical assistance enrollee under K.S.A. 39-709, and 10 amendments thereto.

(c) The secretary of health and environment shall submit to the
 United States centers for medicare and medicaid services any approval
 request necessary to implement this section.

14 (d) The secretary of health and environment shall adopt rules and 15 regulations as necessary to implement and administer this section.

16 Sec. 4. K.S.A. 65-1456 is hereby amended to read as follows: 65-17 1456. (a) The board may suspend or revoke the license of any dentist who shall permit any dental hygienist operating under such dentist's supervision 18 19 to perform any operation other than that those permitted under the 20 provisions of article 14 of chapter 65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, 21 and amendments thereto, and may suspend or revoke the license of any 22 hygienist found guilty of performing any operation other than those 23 permitted under article 14 of chapter 65 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, 24 and amendments thereto. No license of any dentist or dental hygienist shall 25 be suspended or revoked in any administrative proceedings without first 26 complying with the notice and hearing requirements of the Kansas 27 administrative procedure act.

28 (b) The practice of dental hygiene shall include those educational, preventive, and therapeutic procedures which that result in the removal of 29 30 extraneous deposits, stains and debris from the teeth and the rendering of 31 smooth surfaces of the teeth to the depths of the gingival sulci. Included 32 among those educational, preventive and therapeutic procedures are the 33 instruction of the patient as to daily personal care, protecting the teeth 34 from dental caries, the scaling and polishing of the crown surfaces and the 35 planing of the root surfaces, in addition to the curettage of those soft 36 tissues lining the free gingiva to the depth of the gingival sulcus and such 37 additional educational, preventive and therapeutic procedures as the board 38 may establish by rules and regulations.

(c) Subject to such prohibitions, limitations and conditions as the
board may prescribe by rules and regulations, any licensed dental hygienist
may practice dental hygiene and may also perform such dental service as
may be performed by a dental assistant under the provisions of K.S.A. 651423, and amendments thereto.

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1 (d) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the practice of dental 2 hygiene shall be performed under the direct or general supervision of a licensed dentist at the office of such licensed dentist. The board shall 3 4 designate by rules and regulations the procedures-which that may be 5 performed by a dental hygienist under direct supervision and the 6 procedures which that may be performed under general supervision of a 7 licensed dentist. As used in this section: (1) "Direct supervision" means 8 that the dentist is in the dental office, personally diagnoses the condition to 9 be treated, personally authorizes the procedure and before dismissal of the patient evaluates the performance; and (2) "general supervision" means a 10 Kansas licensed dentist may delegate verbally or by written authorization 11 12 the performance of a service, task or procedure to a licensed dental hygienist under the supervision and responsibility of the dentist, if the 13 14 dental hygienist is licensed to perform the function, and the supervising 15 dentist examines the patient at the time the dental hygiene procedure is 16 performed, or during the 12 calendar months preceding the performance of 17 the procedure, except that the licensed hygienist shall not be permitted to 18 diagnose a dental disease or ailment, prescribe any treatment or a regimen 19 thereof, prescribe, order or dispense medication or perform any procedure 20 which that is irreversible or which that involves the intentional cutting of 21 the soft or hard tissue by any means. A dentist is not required to be on the 22 premises at the time a hygienist performs a function delegated under-part 23 paragraph (2) of this subsection.

(e) The practice of dental hygiene may be performed at an adult care
home, hospital long-term care unit, state institution, local health
department or indigent health care clinic on a resident of a facility, client
or patient thereof so long as:

(1) A licensed dentist has delegated the performance of the service,task or procedure;

30 (2) the dental hygienist is under the supervision and responsibility of31 the dentist;

(3) either the supervising dentist is personally present or the services,
 tasks and procedures are limited to the cleaning of teeth, education and
 preventive care; and

(4) the supervising dentist examines the patient at the time the dental
hygiene procedure is performed or has examined the patient during the 12
calendar months preceding performance of the procedure.

(f) The practice of dental hygiene may be performed with consent of
the parent or legal guardian<sub>5</sub>: On children participating in residential and
nonresidential centers for therapeutic services<sub>5</sub>; on all children in families
which *that* are receiving family preservation services<sub>5</sub>; on all children in
the custody of the secretary for children and families or the commissioner
of juvenile justice authority secretary of corrections and in an out-of-home

1 placement residing in foster care homes; on children being served by 2 runaway youth programs and homeless shelters; and on children birth up 3 to five years old and children in public and nonpublic schools in 4 kindergarten or grades one through-grade 12 regardless of the time of year and children participating in youth organizations, so long as such children 5 6 who are dentally underserved are targeted; at any state correctional 7 institution, local health department or indigent health care clinic, as 8 defined in K.S.A. 65-1466, and amendments thereto, and at any federally 9 qualified health center, federally qualified health center look-alike or a 10 community health center that receives funding from section 330 of the health center consolidation act, on a person, inmate, client or patient 11 12 thereof; and on other persons as may be defined by the board; so long as:

13 (1) The dental hygienist has received an "extended care permit I" 14 from the Kansas dental board specifying that the dental hygienist has 15 performed 1,200 hours of dental hygiene care within the past three years or 16 has been an instructor at an accredited dental hygiene program for two 17 academic years within the past three years;

18 (2) the dental hygienist shows proof of professional liability19 insurance;

(3) the dental hygienist is sponsored by a dentist licensed in the state
of Kansas, including a signed agreement stating that the dentist shall
monitor the dental hygienist's activities, except such dentist shall not
monitor more than five dental hygienists with an extended care permit;

24 (4) the tasks and procedures are limited to: (A) Removal of 25 extraneous deposits, stains and debris from the teeth and the rendering of 26 smooth surfaces of the teeth to the depths of the gingival sulci; (B) the 27 application of topical anesthetic if the dental hygienist has completed the 28 required course of instruction approved by the dental board; (C) the 29 application of fluoride: (D) dental hygiene instruction: (E) assessment of the patient's apparent need for further evaluation by a dentist to diagnose 30 31 the presence of dental caries and other abnormalities; and (F) other duties 32 as may be delegated verbally or in writing by the sponsoring dentists 33 consistent with this act;

(5) the dental hygienist advises the patient and legal guardian that the
 services are preventive in nature and do not constitute a comprehensive
 dental diagnosis and care;

(6) the dental hygienist provides a copy of the findings and the report
of treatment to the sponsoring dentist and any other dental or medical
supervisor at a participating organization found in this subsection; and

40 (7) any payment to the dental hygienist for dental hygiene services is
41 received from the sponsoring dentist or the participating organization
42 found in this subsection.

43 (g) The practice of dental hygiene may be performed on persons with

developmental disabilities and on persons who are 65 years and older who
 live in a residential center, an adult care home, subsidized housing,
 hospital long-term care unit, state institution or are served in a community
 senior service center, elderly nutrition program or at the home of a
 homebound person who qualifies for the federal home and community
 based service (HCBS) waiver on a resident of a facility, client or patient
 thereof, so long as:

8 (1) The dental hygienist has received an "extended care permit II" 9 from the Kansas dental board specifying that the dental hygienist has: (A) 10 Performed 1,600 hours of dental hygiene care or has been an instructor at 11 an accredited dental hygiene program for two academic years within the 12 past three years; and (B) completed six hours of training on the care of 13 special needs patients or other training as may be accepted by the board;

14 (2) the dental hygienist shows proof of professional liability 15 insurance;

16 (3) the dental hygienist is sponsored by a dentist licensed in the state 17 of Kansas, including a signed agreement stating that the dentist shall 18 monitor the dental hygienist's activities, except such dentist shall not 19 monitor more than five dental hygienists with an extended care permit II;

(4) the tasks and procedures are limited to: (A) Removal of 20 21 extraneous deposits, stains and debris from the teeth and the rendering of 22 smooth surfaces of the teeth to the depths of the gingival sulci; (B) the 23 application of topical anesthetic if the dental hygienist has completed the 24 required course of instruction approved by the dental board; (C) the 25 application of fluoride; (D) dental hygiene instruction; (E) assessment of the patient's apparent need for further evaluation by a dentist to diagnose 26 27 the presence of dental caries and other abnormalities; and (F) other duties 28 as may be delegated verbally or in writing by the sponsoring dentist 29 consistent with this act:

(5) the dental hygienist advises the patient and legal guardian that the
 services are preventive in nature and do not constitute comprehensive
 dental diagnosis and care;

(6) the dental hygienist provides a copy of the findings and the report
of treatment to the sponsoring dentist and any other dental or medical
supervisor at a participating organization found in this subsection;

(7) any payment to the dental hygienist for dental hygiene services is
 received from the sponsoring dentist or the participating organization
 found in this subsection; and

(8) the dental hygienist completes a minimum of three hours of
education in the area of special needs care within the board's continuing
dental education requirements for relicensure renewal of licensure.

42 (h) The expanded practice of dental hygiene may be performed with 43 consent of the parent or legal guardian; On children participating in

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residential and nonresidential centers for therapeutic services; on all 1 children in families-which that are receiving family preservation services; 2 3 on all children in the custody of the secretary for children and families or 4 the commissioner of juvenile justice authority secretary of corrections and 5 in an out-of-home placement residing in foster care homes,; on children 6 being served by runaway youth programs and homeless shelters; and on 7 children-birth up to five years old and children in public and nonpublic 8 schools in kindergarten or grades one through-grade 12 regardless of the 9 time of year and children participating in youth organizations, so long as such children who are dentally underserved are targeted; at any state 10 correctional institution, local health department or indigent health care 11 12 clinic, as defined in K.S.A. 65-1466, and amendments thereto, and at any 13 federally qualified health center, federally qualified health center look-14 alike or a community health center that receives funding from section 330 15 of the health center consolidation act, on a person, inmate, client or 16 patient; on persons with developmental disabilities and on persons who are 17 65 years and older who live in a residential center, an adult care home, subsidized housing, hospital long-term care unit, state institution or are 18 19 served in a community senior service center, elderly nutrition program or 20 at the home of a homebound person who qualifies for the federal home and 21 community based service (HCBS) waiver on a resident of a facility, client 22 or patient thereof; so long as:

23 (1) The dental hygienist has received an "extended care permit III" 24 from the Kansas dental board specifying that the dental hygienist has: (A) 25 Performed 2,000 hours of dental hygiene care or has been an instructor at an accredited dental hygiene program for three academic years within the 26 27 past four years; and (B) completed a course of study of 18 seat hours 28 approved by the board-which that includes, but is not limited to, 29 emergency dental care techniques, the preparation and placement of 30 temporary restorations, the adjustment of dental prostheses and appropriate 31 pharmacology;

32 (2) the dental hygienist shows proof of professional liability 33 insurance;

(3) the dental hygienist is sponsored by a dentist licensed in the state
of Kansas, including a signed agreement stating that the dentist shall
monitor the dental hygienist's activities, except such dentist shall not
monitor more than five dental hygienists with an extended care permit III;

(4) the tasks and procedures are limited to: (A) Removal of extraneous deposits, stains and debris from the teeth and the rendering of smooth surfaces of the teeth to the depths of the gingival sulci; (B) the application of topical anesthetic, if the dental hygienist has completed the required course of instruction approved by the dental board; (C) the application of fluoride; (D) dental hygiene instruction; (E) assessment of

1 the patient's apparent need for further evaluation by a dentist to diagnose the presence of dental caries and other abnormalities; (F) identification and 2 3 removal of decay using hand instrumentation and placing a temporary 4 filling, including glass ionomer and other palliative materials; (G) 5 adjustment of dentures, placing soft reline in dentures, checking partial 6 dentures for sore spots and placing permanent identification labeling in 7 dentures; (H) smoothing of a sharp tooth with a slow speed dental 8 handpiece; (I) use of local anesthetic, including topical, infiltration and 9 block anesthesia, when appropriate to assist with procedures where 10 medical services are available in a nursing home, health clinic or any other settings if the dental hygienist has completed a course on local anesthesia 11 12 and nitrous oxide as required in this act; (J) extraction of deciduous teeth that are partially exfoliated with class-4 3 mobility; and (K) other duties as 13 14 may be delegated verbally or in writing by the sponsoring dentist 15 consistent with this act:

16 (5) the dental hygienist advises the patient and *parent or* legal 17 guardian that the services are palliative or preventive in nature and do not 18 constitute comprehensive dental diagnosis and care;

(6) the dental hygienist provides a copy of the findings and the report
of treatment to the sponsoring dentist and any other dental or medical
supervisor at a participating organization found in this subsection;

(7) the dental hygienist notifies the patient or the patient's parent or
legal guardian of such patient's need for treatment by a dentist, when the
dental hygienist finds an apparent need for evaluation to diagnose the
presence of dental caries and other abnormalities;

(8) any payment to the dental hygienist for dental hygiene services is
received from the sponsoring dentist or the participating organization
found in this subsection; and

(9) the dental hygienist completes a minimum of three hours of
education related to the expanded scope of dental hygiene practice in
subsection (h)(4) of this act paragraph (4) within the board's continuing
dental education requirements for relicensure renewal of licensure.

(i) In addition to the duties specifically mentioned in subsection (b),any duly licensed dental hygienist may:

(1) Give fluoride treatments as a prophylactic measure, as defined by
the United States public health service and as recommended for use in
dentistry;

(2) remove overhanging restoration margins and periodontal surgerymaterials by hand scaling instruments; and

40 (3) administer local block and infiltration anaesthesia and nitrous 41 oxide.

42 (A) The administration of local anaesthesia shall be performed under 43 the direct supervision of a licensed dentist except that topically applied local anaesthesia, as defined by the board, may be administered under the
 general supervision of a licensed dentist.

3 (B) Each dental hygienist who administers local anaesthesia 4 regardless of the type shall have completed courses of instruction in local 5 anaesthesia and nitrous oxide which *that* have been approved by the board.

6 (j) (1) The courses of instruction required in subsection (i)(3)(B) shall 7 provide a minimum of 12 hours of instruction at a teaching institution 8 accredited by the American dental association.

9 (2) The courses of instruction shall include courses—which that 10 provide both didactic and clinical instruction in: (A) Theory of pain 11 control; (B) anatomy; (C) medical history; (D) pharmacology; and (E) 12 emergencies and complications.

13 (3) Certification in cardiac pulmonary resuscitation shall be required14 in all cases.

(k) The board is authorized to issue to a qualified dental hygienist an
extended care permit I or extended care permit II, or extended care permit
III as provided in subsections (f), (g) and (h) of this section.

(1) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent a dental
 hygienist from providing dental hygiene instruction or visual oral health
 care screenings or fluoride applications in a school or <u>community based</u>
 *community-based* setting regardless of the age of the patient.

(m) As used in this section, "dentally underserved" means a person
 who lacks resources to pay for medically necessary health care services
 and who meets the eligibility criteria for qualification as a medically
 indigent person established by the secretary of health and environment
 under K.S.A. 75-6120, and amendments thereto.
