## SENATE BILL No. 366

AN ACT concerning occupational regulation; relating to occupational 1 2 licenses for certain applicants; amending K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 48-3406 3 and repealing the existing section. 4 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: Section 1. K.S.A. 2019 Supp. 48-3406 is hereby amended to read as 6 7 follows: 48-3406. (a) For the purposes of this section: (1) "Licensing body" means an official, agency, board or other entity 8 of the state which authorizes individuals to practice a profession in this 9 state and issues a license, registration, certificate, permit or other 10 11 authorization to an individual so authorized; 12 (2) "Military servicemember" means a member of the army, navy, 13 marine corps, air force, air or army national guard of any state, coast guard or any branch of the military reserves of the United States; and with an 14 15 honorable discharge. (3) "Military spouse" means the spouse of an individual who is 16 currently in active service in any branch of the armed forces of the United 17 18 States. 19 "Applicant" means an individual who is a military spouse, (4) 20 military servicemember or an individual who has established or intends to 21 establish residency in this state. (5) "Private certification" is a voluntary program in which a private 22 23 organization grants nontransferable recognition to an individual who 24 meets personal qualifications and standards relevant to performing the 25 occupation as determined by the private organization. 26 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any licensing body 27 shall: 28 (1), upon submission of a completed application, issue a license, 29 registration or certification to a nonresident military spouse an applicant, 30 so that the nonresident military spouse applicant may lawfully practice the 31 person's occupation; and 32 (2) upon submission of a completed application within six monthsfollowing release from military service, issue a license, registration or 33 certification to a military servicemember with an honorable discharge so 34 that the military servicemember may lawfully practice the military-35 servicemember's occupation. 36

1 (c) A military servicemember with an honorable discharge ornonresident military spouse An applicant shall receive a license, 2 registration or certification under subsection (b) of this section: 3

(1) If the applicable Kansas licensure, registration or certification by 4 5 endorsement, reinstatement or reciprocity statutes are more favorable to 6 applicants, as determined by the licensing body, then pursuant to 7 applicable licensure, registration or certification by endorsement, 8 reinstatement or reciprocity statutes of the licensing body of this state for the profession professional license, registration or certification within-60 9 10 business days from the date a complete application was submitted; or 10

(2) *if such provisions are less favorable to applicants, as determined* 11 12 by the licensing body, or if the Kansas professional practice act does not have licensure, registration or certification by endorsement, reinstatement 13 or reciprocity statutes, then the applicant shall receive a license, 14 15 registration or certification as provided herein if, at the time of 16 application, the military servicemember or nonresident military spouse-17 applicant:

18 (A) Holds a valid current license, registration or certification in 19 another state, district or territory of the United States with licensure, registration or certification requirements that the licensing body 20 21 determines are substantially equivalent to those established by the 22 licensing body of this state, or holds a certification issued by another state 23 for practicing the occupation but this state requires an occupational 24 license, and the licensing body determines that the certification 25 requirements are substantially equivalent to the licensing requirements 26 established by the licensing body of this state:

27 (B) has not committed an act in any jurisdiction that would have 28 constituted grounds for the limitation, suspension or revocation or that the 29 applicant has never been censured or had other disciplinary action taken or had an application for licensure, registration or certification denied or 30 31 refused to practice an occupation for which the military servicemember or 32 nonresident military spouse applicant seeks licensure, registration or 33 certification:

34 (C) has not been disciplined by a licensing, registering, certifying or 35 other credentialing entity in another jurisdiction and is not the subject of 36 an unresolved complaint, review procedure or disciplinary proceeding 37 conducted by a licensing, registering, certifying or other credentialing 38 entity in another jurisdiction nor has surrendered their membership on any 39 professional staff in any professional association or society or faculty for another state or jurisdiction while under investigation or to avoid adverse 40 41 action for acts or conduct similar to acts or conduct-which that would constitute grounds for disciplinary action in a Kansas practice act; 42

43 (D) does not have a disqualifying criminal record as determined by 1 the Kansas licensing body of this state under Kansas law;

2 (E) provides proof of solvency, financial standing, bonding or 3 insurance if required by the licensing body of this state, but only to the 4 same extent as required of any applicant with similar credentials or 5 experience;

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(F) pays any fees required by the licensing body of this state; and

7 (E)(G) submits with the application a signed affidavit stating that the 8 application information, including necessary prior employment history, is 9 true and accurate.

Upon receiving such affidavit a complete application, the licensing 10 body shall issue the license, registration or certification within-60 10 11 business days from the date a complete application was submitted, to the 12 military servicemember or nonresident military spouse applicant on a 13 probationary basis, but may revoke the license, registration or certification 14 15 at any time if the information provided in the application is found to be 16 false. Any The probationary-license issued under this subsection to amilitary servicemember or nonresident military spouse period shall not 17 exceed six months. 18

(d) Any-person *individual* who has not been in the active practice of
the occupation during the two years preceding the application for which
the applicant seeks a license, registration or certification *under subsections (b) and (c)* may be required to complete such additional testing, training,
mentoring, monitoring or education as the Kansas licensing body may
deem necessary to establish the applicant's present ability to practice with
reasonable skill and safety, *as provided by subsection (j)*.

(e) Upon submission of a completed application, an applicant shall
receive an occupational license, registration or certification under
subsection (b) based on the applicant's work experience in another state, if
the applicant:

30 (1) Worked in a state that does not use an occupational license, 31 registration or certification to regulate an occupation, but this state uses 32 an occupational license, registration or certification to regulate the 33 occupation;

(2) worked for at least three years in the occupation during the four
 years immediately preceding the application; and

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(3) satisfies the requirements of subsection (c)(2)(B) through (G).

(f) Upon submission of a completed application, an applicant shall
receive an occupational license, registration or certification under
subsection (b) based on the applicant's holding of a private certification
and work experience in another state, if the applicant:

41 (1) Holds a private certification and worked in a state that does not
42 use an occupational license or government certification to regulate an
43 occupation, but this state uses an occupational license or government

1 *certification to regulate the occupation;* 

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(2) worked for at least two years in the occupation;
(3) holds a current and valid private certification in the occupation;

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(4) is held in good standing by the organization that issued the private certification; and

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(5) satisfies the requirements of subsection (c)(2)(B) through (G).

7 (g) A nonresident-military spouse applicant licensed, registered or certified under this section shall be entitled to the same rights and subject 8 9 to the same obligations as are provided by the licensing body for Kansas residents, except that revocation or suspension of a nonresident-military 10 spouse's applicant's license, registration or certificate in the nonresident 11 12 military spouse's applicant's state of residence or any jurisdiction in which the nonresident-military spouse applicant held a license, registration or 13 14 certificate shall automatically cause the same revocation or suspension of 15 such nonresident-military spouse's applicant's license, registration or 16 certificate in Kansas. No hearing shall be granted to a nonresident-military spouse applicant where such nonresident-military spouse's applicant's 17 18 license, registration or certificate is subject to such automatic revocation or 19 suspension except for the purpose of establishing the fact of revocation or suspension of the nonresident-military spouse's applicant's license, 20 21 registration or certificate by the nonresident-military spouse's applicant's 22 state of residence.

23 (f)(h) In the event the licensing body determines that the license, 24 registration or certificate currently held by the military servicemember or 25 nonresident military spouse applicant under subsection (c)(2)(A) is not substantially equivalent to those issued by the licensing body of this state, 26 27 the licensing body-may shall issue a temporary permit for a limited period 28 of time to allow the military servicemember or nonresident military spouse 29 applicant to lawfully practice the military servicemember's or nonresident 30 military spouse's applicant's occupation while completing any specific requirements that are required in this state for licensure, registration or 31 32 certification that was not required in the state, district or territory of the 33 United States in which the military servicemember or nonresident military 34 spouse applicant was licensed, registered, certified or otherwise 35 credentialed, unless the licensing body determines, based on specific 36 grounds, that issuing a temporary permit would jeopardize the safety of 37 the public. Any determination by the licensing body that the license, 38 registration or certificate currently held by the applicant is not 39 substantially equivalent shall be based on specific grounds. All 40 determinations by the licensing body under this subsection or subsection 41 (i) shall set forth the facts considered and the reasoning applied with 42 respect to every specified ground of the determination and shall be 43 provided to the applicant in writing within 10 business days of the date of 1 *the application.* 

2 (i) In the event that the licensing body determines that the private 3 certification or work experience currently held by the applicant under subsection (e) or (f) is not sufficient to establish the applicant's present 4 ability to practice with reasonable skill and safety, the applicant may be 5 6 required to complete such additional testing, training, mentoring, 7 monitoring or education as the licensing body deems necessary. The 8 applicant shall be issued a temporary permit for a limited period of time to allow the applicant to lawfully practice the occupation while 9 completing any specific requirements unless the licensing body finds, 10 based on specific grounds, that issuing a temporary permit would 11 12 jeopardize the safety of the public.

(j) Any testing, education or training requirements administered
under subsection (d), (h) or (i) shall be limited to Kansas law that
regulates the occupation and that is materially different from or additional
to the law of another state, or shall be limited to any materially different
or additional body of knowledge or skill required for the occupational
license, registration or certification in Kansas.

19 (g)(k) A licensing body may grant licensure, registration, certification 20 or a temporary permit to any person who meets the requirements under 21 this section but was separated from such military service under less than 22 honorable conditions or with a general discharge under honorable 23 conditions.

24 (l) Nothing in this section shall be construed as prohibiting a 25 licensing body from applying a rule or regulation or a reciprocal or other applicable statutory provision that is more favorable to an applicant than 26 27 the provisions of this section. Licensing bodies shall apply such provisions 28 or the provisions of this section most favorable to applicants as determined by the licensing body. Nothing in this section shall be 29 30 construed to apply in conflict with or in a manner inconsistent with federal 31 law or a multistate compact.

32 (h)(m) Each licensing body may shall adopt rules and regulations
 33 necessary to implement and carry out the provisions of this section.

(i)(n) This section shall not apply to the practice of law or the regulation of attorneys pursuant to K.S.A. 7-103, and amendments thereto. (a) This section shall apply to all licensing bodies not excluded under
