Dear Chairman Hilderbrand and Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee Members,

I ask you to support SB 212. One of our children received her first dose of vaccinations at the age of 2. She had serious effects from this. Pain was continual every day for 6 weeks. She had high pitched crying. She was unable to sleep at night. When trying to sleep her body would arch and she would cry in constant pain. I continually took her to the doctor who just proscribed heavier antibiotics which made things worse. She started making retarded motions with her hands. I then took her to a natural doctor and she began to improve immediately. The county nurses continued to call telling me to finish her vaccinations. I told them she wasn't well from the vaccines first given but they didn't care or want to hear what we had to say. They didn't care if they permanently damaged my child as long as she finished the vaccine schedule. They had no empathy. She is older now and still suffering from the first dose of vaccines with a poor immune system and gut issues. These vaccines are not safe. The Covid vaccine could kill her.

I had 6 children all vaccinated. Allergies are rampant in our family. They have food allergies to dairy, gluten, corn, and eggs. I have one child with epilepsy which does not run in the family. From research I do believe this is a delayed reaction from the vaccines.

Such as if your child is sick they should not receive the vaccines. They never ask if your child is sick or having problems. These people are not trustworthy and have already caused devastating problems that are unreversible in our children. I ask you to support this bill to protect our children from big pharma making money off the vaccines and causing untold damage.
