



Fair Wages

- \$18.50-\$20.50 an hour, and only go up based on position, tenure, shift, etc.
- Over the past year and a half, SCPC has increased wages by over 43%.



Healthcare

- We offer Health, Dental, Vision, Short and Long Term Disability
- We also offer a 401K plan to eligible employees.



Continuing Education

- SugarCreek University and S-T-A-Y Initiative both of which are focused on professional and personal development of our associates.



Affordable Housing

- We provide temporary housing for employees, often renovating historic or blighted buildings improving nearby neighborhood.



Transportation

- We provide transport for many of our associates who either do not drive or do not have a car.



Childcare

- We are committed to provide subsidized childcare at all of our facilities.
- Through creative partnerships the we have been able to provide childcare centers at 2 of our facilities to date.



Washington Court House, OH

- 100 Child capacity center onsite
- 500 Employee site
- Company owned, operated by private provider
- 84% full, 24% Company enrollees, 76% Community enrollees
- Rates -\$120 - \$170 / week
- Worker's pay \$11 to start \$13 average

Cambridge City, IN

- 62 Child capacity center @ elementary school
- 700 Employee site
- Company funded, YMCA operated at in the local school
- 56% full, 20% Company enrollees, 80% Community enrollees
- Rates -\$110 - \$140 / week
- Worker's pay \$10.30 to start \$11.30 "Lead Teacher"

"The average annual rate for infant care in Kansas in 2020 was \$12,811 at Child Care Centers and \$7,517 at Family Child Care, which is approximately \$230 higher than the national annual price of infant care was in 2019." = \$246 per week for infants

Key Learnings

Wins

- More, high quality, affordable childcare opportunities in “childcare deserts”
- Employee Benefit, Workforce Participation
- Cultivate Business/Community relationships

Challenges

- Finances/Funding
 - Investment incentives/grants - Property tax breaks?
- Staffing
 - Low pay — tax breaks?
 - Healthcare —can they buy in local teacher’s coverage?
- Achieving affordable rate threshold





- SugarCreek Early Learning Center inside the Frontenac Industrial Park where the jobs are
- \$8.7 Million investment, 200+ capacity center to be operated through a joint venture with USD #246 and New Foundations
- SugarCreek will fund and manage construction and is seeking as much Federal, State and Local funding assistance as possible
- Higher levels of funding assistance will impact the number of new, quality, affordable early child development opportunities added to Crawford County, KS
