AN ACT concerning education; establishing Erin's law; relating to teacher training and student instruction; identifying signs of child sexual abuse.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) This section shall be known and may be cited as Erin's law.

- (b) The state board of education shall:
- (1) Implement statewide standards that assure all public school teachers annually receive training and education on identifying likely warning signs indicating that a child may be a victim of sexual abuse; and
- (2) review and consider statewide social and emotional standards for student instruction on the difference between appropriate and inappropriate conduct, actions a child may take to be protected from child sexual abuse and methods for reporting any instance of sexual abuse. The review may include, but is not limited to:
 - (A) The age of the students to receive the instruction;
- (B) requirements for parental notification and the ability for a parent to exclude a child from such instruction;
- (C) best practices in instructional content and delivery methods to achieve desired educational outcome; and
 - (D) collaboration with subject matter experts and child advocates.
- (c) The state board shall submit a report of progress and any plan or standards developed with regard to those items listed in subsection (b) by February 1, 2022, to the legislature.
- (d) On or before January 1, 2022, the state board of education shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this section.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
