AN ACT establishing the Kansas commission for the United States
semiquincentennial in the department of wildlife, parks and tourism;
prescribing commission membership, responsibilities, meetings and
expiration; creating the Kansas commission for the United States
semiquincentennial gifts and donations fund.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:
Section 1. (a) Sections 1 through 10, and amendments thereto, shall
be known and may be cited as the Kansas commission for the United
States semiquincentennial act.
(b) As used in sections 1 through 10, and amendments thereto:
(1) "Act" means the Kansas commission for the United States
semiquincentennial act; and
(2) "commission" means the Kansas commission for the United
States semiquincentennial.
Sec. 2. (a) The Kansas commission for the United States
semiquincentennial is hereby established within and as a part of the
department of wildlife, parks and tourism to plan, encourage, develop and
coordinate the commemoration of the 250 th anniversary of the founding of
the United States and to recognize the impact of this event on the people of
Kansas and the nation's past, present and future.
(b) The commission shall cooperate with the United States
semiquincentennial commission and various state agencies, boards,
commissions, departments and political subdivisions in order to execute
commemorative events and to implement educational activities, events and
celebrations related to the semiquincentennial of the United States.
Sec. 3. (a) The commission shall consist of -14 15 voting members as
follows:
(1) The secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism or the secretary's-
designee;
(2) the secretary of commerce or the secretary's designee;
(1) One representative from a county economic development
corporation or local chamber of commerce, appointed by the secretary
of commerce;
(2) the executive director of the Kansas African American affairs
commission or the executive director's designee;
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(3) the executive director of the Kansas Hispanic and Latino 1 2 American affairs commission or the executive director's designee;

(3)(4) the executive director of the Kansas state historical society or 3 the executive director's designee; 4

5 (4)(5) two members of the house of representatives to be appointed 6 by the speaker of the house of representatives, including one member each 7 from the majority and minority party;

8 (5)(6) two members of the senate to be appointed by the president of 9 the senate, including one member each from the majority and minority 10 party;

11 (6)(7) the state regent of the Kansas society daughters of the 12 American revolution or the state regent's designee;

(7)(8) the president of the Kansas society sons of the American 13 revolution or the president's designee; 14

(8)(9) the president of the Kansas historical foundation or the 15 16 president's designee;

17 (9)(10) one representative from the Kansas bar association, appointed 18 by the president of the association;

19 (10)(11) one professor of American history from a Kansas institution 20 of higher education, appointed by the president of the state board of 21 regents;

22 (11)(12) one teacher of American history from a public school, 23 appointed by the state board of education; and

24 (12)(13) one representative appointed by the Kansas native American 25 affairs office.

26 (b) Members shall be appointed for the duration of the commission but shall serve only for as long as such members remain in the position 27 28 that originally qualified such member for appointment.

29 (c) A vacancy on the commission shall not affect the powers of the commission. Each vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the 30 31 original appointment.

32 Sec. 4. (a) The commission shall plan, coordinate and implement a 33 program in 2026 to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the founding of 34 the United States. In developing the plans and overall program for the 35 event, the commission shall:

36 (1) Give due consideration to related plans and programs developed 37 by federal, state, local and private groups;

38 (2) hold public meetings to solicit the input of Kansas citizens 39 throughout the state in developing programs for the semiquincentennial. The first public meeting shall be held within 90 days of the commission's 40 first meeting and public meetings shall continue throughout the 41 commission's existence: 42

43 (3) showcase all counties of the state;

1 (4) draw attention to the achievements, struggles, honors, innovations 2 and impacts of all people in the state;

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(5) clearly delineate all expenses incurred by the commission in 4 developing the program; and

5 (6) create website to communicate for а plans the 6 semiquincentennial; and

7 (7) solicit gifts and donations from private industry, corporations 8 and individuals to support the commission's goals.

(b) To aid in developing plans, the commission may designate special 9 committees with representatives from groups described in section 2(b), 10 and amendments thereto, to plan, develop and coordinate specific 11 12 activities

13 Sec. 5. Meetings of the commission shall be held throughout the state at times and locations determined by the chairperson, who shall be 14 selected by a majority vote of the commission and may serve up to two 15 16 consecutive two-year terms. In the case of a national, state or local emergency, making meeting in person dangerous or impossible, the 17 18 commission may meet in another manner where all participants can 19 participate with each other at the same time, including using an electronic platform. The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the 20 21 secretary of wildlife, parks and tourism or the secretary's state regent of 22 the Kansas society daughters of the American revolution or the state 23 regent's designee. A majority of the members of the commission 24 constitutes a quorum.

25 Sec. 6. (a) (1) On or before December 31, 2022, the commission shall submit a comprehensive report to the governor, the secretary of 26 commerce, the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of 27 28 representatives that contains the commission's specific recommendations for the commemoration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the 29 United States and related events. 30

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(2) The report shall include:

32 (A) A detailed timeline of the commission's plan for the overall 33 program through 2027;

34 (B) the commission's recommendations for the allocation of costs 35 among public and private entities that provide financial and administrative 36 assistance to the commission;

37 (C) the projected number of jobs created through the implementation 38 of the commission's plan and overall program;

39 (D) the projected economic impact of the implementation of the commission's plan and overall program on the economy of Kansas; 40

(E) the geographic impact of the commission's plan and overall 41 program on all counties of this state; and 42

43 (F) outputs and outcomes against which progress and success of the

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1 commission's plan and overall program can be measured.

2 (3) The commission shall make the comprehensive report available to 3 the public on the commission's website.

4 (b) (1) The commission shall submit an annual report to the governor, 5 the secretary of commerce, the speaker of the house of representatives 6 and the president of the senate detailing the commission's activities on or 7 before December 31, 2023, and by December 31 each year thereafter. The 8 report shall include an accounting of funds received and expended during 9 the year covered by the report, the outputs and outcomes achieved and 10 whether those achievements meet the commission's plan and overall 11 program goals.

12 (2) The commission shall make the annual report available to the 13 public on the commission's website.

Sec. 7. (a) The commission may accept, use and dispose of gifts and donations of money, property or personal services. The type and quantity of gifts shall be enumerated and submitted to the Kansas governmental ethics commission each quarter and shall be made available to the public on the commission's website.

19 (b)There is hereby established in the state treasury the Kansas 20 commission for the United States semiguincentennial gifts and donations 21 fund, and such fund shall be administered by the secretary of wildlife, 22 parks and tourism. All expenditures from the Kansas commission for the 23 United States semiguincentennial gifts and donations fund shall be for Kansas 24 promoting the commission for the United States 25 semiguincentennial. All expenditures from the Kansas commission for the 26 United States semiguincentennial gifts and donations fund shall be made 27 in accordance with appropriation acts upon warrants of the director of 28 accounts and reports issued pursuant to vouchers approved by the 29 secretary or the secretary's designee.

30 On December 31, 2027, the director of accounts and reports shall (c) 31 transfer all moneys in the Kansas commission for the United States 32 semiquincentennial gifts and donations fund to the operating expenditures 33 account of the of the state economic development initiatives fund of the 34 department of wildlife, parks and tourism. On December 31, 2027, all 35 liabilities of the Kansas commission for the United States 36 semiquincentennial gifts and donations fund shall be transferred to and 37 imposed upon the operating expenditures account of the state economic 38 development initiatives fund-of the of the department of wildlife, parks 39 and tourism; and the Kansas commission for the United States 40 semiguincentennial gifts and donations fund shall be abolished.

- 41 Sec. 8. (a) The commission may:
- 42 (1) Procure supplies, services and property;
- 43 (2) enter into contracts;

1 (3) expend, in furtherance of this act, funds donated or received 2 pursuant to contracts entered into under this act in the Kansas commission 3 for the United States semiguincentennial gifts and donations fund; and

- 4 (4) take action as necessary to enable the commission to effectuate 5 the purposes of this act.
- 6 (b) Any action taken pursuant to subsection (a) shall first be approved 7 by majority vote of the commission.
- 8 Sec. 9. (a) Commission members shall not receive compensation for 9 their work with the commission.
- (b) Non-legislative citizen members of the commission shall not
 receive compensation, subsistence allowances, mileage or reimbursement
 for expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

13 Sec. 10. (a) The provisions of sections 1 through 10 of this act, and 14 amendments thereto, shall expire on December 31, 2027.

(b) Upon the expiration of the commission on December 31, 2027,
any property remaining property in the possession of the commission may
be donated to local municipalities or other state agencies by the secretary
of wildlife, parks and tourism.

Sec. 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after itspublication in the statute book.
