AN ACT concerning STAR bonds; prohibiting public officials from 1 2 benefiting from STAR bond projects: relating to the financing of STAR 3 bond projects and rural redevelopment projects; eligible areas; public 4 notice of hearings on city or county website; posting of documents and 5 link to department of commerce database; disclosure of names of 6 developer; major business facility; real estate transfers; plan for 7 tracking the number of visitors; feasibility study requirements; 8 disclosure of state, federal and local tax incentives within STAR bond district; capital investment and annual sales requirements; STAR bond 9 10 districts; contiguity; project costs; sunset date; amending K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,162, 12-17,165, 12-17,166, 12-17,169, 12-17,171 and 12-11 12 17,179 and repealing the existing sections. 13 14 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas: 15 New Section 1. (a) No state or local government official shall be 16 employed by a STAR bond project developer or manager. 17 For the purposes of this section: (b) 18 "Employed" means direct employment or work as an independent (1)19 contractor for the project developer or manager. 20 "State or local government official" means a member of the (2)21 legislature, an appointed or elected official or officer of any state agency, 22 office, board, commission, authority or institution and an appointed or 23 elected official, officer or member of the government authority of any 24 government subdivision, including any city, county, township, school 25 district, special district, board or commission. 26 (c) This section shall be a part of and supplemental to the STAR 27 bonds financing act. 28 K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,162 is hereby amended to read as Sec. 2. 29 follows: 12-17,162. As used in the STAR-bond bonds financing act, the 30 following words and phrases shall have the following meanings unless a 31 different meaning clearly appears from the context: (a) "Auto race track facility" means: (1) An auto race track facility 32 33 and facilities directly related and necessary to the operation of an auto race 34 track facility, including, but not limited to, grandstands, suites and viewing 35 areas, concessions, souvenir facilities, catering facilities, visitor and retail 36 centers, signage and temporary hospitality facilities, but excluding (2)

hotels, motels, restaurants and retail facilities, not directly related to or
 necessary to the operation of such facility.

3 (b) "Commence work" means the manifest commencement of actual 4 operations on the development site, such as, erecting a building, 5 excavating the ground to lay a foundation or a basement or work of like 6 description which a person with reasonable diligence can see and 7 recognize as being done according to an approved plan of construction, 8 with the intention and purpose to continue work until the project is 9 completed.

10 (c) "De-minimus minimis" means an amount less than 15% of the 11 land area within a STAR bond project district.

12 (d) "Developer" means any person, firm, corporation, partnership or 13 limited liability company other than a city and other than an agency, 14 political subdivision or instrumentality of the state. "Developer" includes 15 the names of the owners, partners, officers or principals of the developer 16 for purposes of inclusion of the name of the developer into any 17 application, document or report pursuant to this act if such application, 18 document or report is a public record.

(e) "Economic impact study" means a study to project the financialbenefit of the project to the local, regional and state economies.

(f) "Eligible area" means a historic theater, major tourism area, major
motorsports complex, auto race track facility, river walk canal facility,
major multi-sport athletic complex, *major business facility* or a major
commercial entertainment and tourism area as determined by the secretary.

(g) "Feasibility study" means a feasibility study as defined in K.S.A.
2020 Supp. 12-17,166(b), and amendments thereto.

(h) "Historic theater" means a building constructed prior to 1940
which that was constructed for the purpose of staging entertainment,
including motion pictures, vaudeville shows or operas, that is operated by
a nonprofit corporation and is designated by the state historic preservation
officer as eligible to be on the Kansas register of historic places or is a
member of the Kansas historic theatre association.

(i) "Historic theater sales tax increment" means the amount of state
and local sales tax revenue imposed pursuant to K.S.A. 12-187 et seq., 793601 et seq. and 79-3701 et seq., and amendments thereto, collected from
taxpayers doing business within the historic theater that is in excess of the
amount of such taxes collected prior to the designation of the building as a
historic theater for purposes of this act.

(j) "Major business facility" means a significant business
headquarters or office building development designed to draw a
substantial number of new visitors to Kansas and that has agreed to
provide visitor tracking data to the secretary as requested by the secretary,
including, but not limited to, residence zip code information, to be

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provided or held by the secretary without personally identifiable
 information. A major business facility shall meet sales tax increment
 revenue requirements that shall be established by the secretary
 independent of any associated retail businesses located in the STAR bond
 project district pursuant to the STAR bond project plan.

6 (k) "Major commercial entertainment and tourism area" means an 7 area that may include, but not be limited to, a major multi-sport athletic 8 complex.

9 (k)(l) "Major motorsports complex" means a complex in Shawnee county that is utilized for the hosting of competitions involving motor 10 vehicles, including, but not limited to, automobiles, motorcycles or other 11 12 self-propelled vehicles other than a motorized bicycle or motorized 13 wheelchair. Such project may include racetracks, all facilities directly 14 related and necessary to the operation of a motorsports complex, 15 including, but not limited to, parking lots, grandstands, suites and viewing 16 areas, concessions, souvenir facilities, catering facilities, visitor and retail 17 centers, signage and temporary hospitality facilities, but excluding hotels, 18 motels, restaurants and retail facilities not directly related to or necessary 19 to the operation of such facility.

20 (1)(m) "Major tourism area" means an area for which the secretary has 21 made a finding the capital improvements costing not less than 22 \$100,000,000 will be built in the state to construct an auto race track 23 facility.

24 (m)(n) "Major multi-sport athletic complex" means an athletic 25 complex that is utilized for the training of athletes, the practice of athletic teams, the plaving of athletic games or the hosting of events. Such project 26 27 may include playing fields, parking lots and other developments including 28 grandstands, suites and viewing areas, concessions, souvenir facilities, catering facilities, visitor centers, signage and temporary hospitality 29 facilities, but excluding hotels, motels, restaurants and retail facilities, not 30 31 directly related to or necessary to the operation of such facility.

32 (n)(o) "Market study" means a study to determine the ability of the 33 project to gain market share locally, regionally and nationally and the 34 ability of the project to gain sufficient market share to:

35 36 (1) Remain profitable past the term of repayment; and

(2) maintain status as a significant factor for travel decisions.

37 (o)(p) "Market impact study" means a study to measure the impact of 38 the proposed project on similar businesses in the project's market area.

39 (p)(q) "Museum facility" means a separate newly-constructed 40 museum building and facilities directly related and necessary to the 41 operation thereof, including gift shops and restaurant facilities, but 42 excluding hotels, motels, restaurants and retail facilities not directly related 43 to or necessary to the operation of such facility. The museum facility shall 1 be owned by the state, a city, county, other political subdivision of the state

2 or a non-profit corporation, shall be managed by the state, a city, county, other political subdivision of the state or a non-profit corporation and may 3 4 not be leased to any developer and shall not be located within any retail or 5 commercial building.

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(q)(r)"Project" means a STAR bond project.

7 (r)(s) "Project costs" means those costs necessary to implement a 8 STAR bond project plan, including costs incurred for:

(1) Acquisition of real property within the STAR bond project area;

(2) payment of relocation assistance pursuant to a relocation 10 assistance plan as provided in K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,173, and 11 amendments thereto; 12

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(3) site preparation including utility relocations; (4) sanitary and storm sewers and lift stations;

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(5) drainage conduits, channels, levees and river walk canal facilities;

16 (6) street grading, paving, graveling, macadamizing, curbing, 17 guttering and surfacing;

(7) street light fixtures, connection and facilities;

19 (8) underground gas, water, heating and electrical services and 20 connections located within the public right-of-way;

(9) sidewalks and pedestrian underpasses or overpasses;

22 (10)drives and driveway approaches located within the public right-23 of-wav:

24 (11)water mains and extensions:

25 (12)plazas and arcades;

26 (13) parking facilities and multilevel parking structures devoted to 27 parking only;

28 (14) landscaping and plantings, fountains. shelters. benches. 29 sculptures, lighting, decorations and similar amenities;

(15) auto race track facility; 30

31 major multi-sport athletic complex; (16)

32 (17) museum facility;

33 (18) major motorsports complex;

34 (19) rural redevelopment project, including costs incurred in connection with the construction or renovation of buildings or other 35 36 structures:

37 (20) related expenses to redevelop and finance the project, except that 38 for a STAR bond project financed with special obligation bonds payable from the revenues described in K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,169(a)(1), and 39 40 amendments thereto, such expenses shall require prior approval by the 41 secretary of commerce; and

42 (20)(21) except as specified in paragraphs (1) through (19) (20) above, "project costs-shall" does not include: 43

1 (A) Costs incurred in connection with the construction of buildings or 2 other structures;

3 (B) fees and commissions paid to developers, real estate agents, 4 financial advisors or any other consultants who represent the developers or 5 any other businesses considering locating in or located in a STAR bond 6 project district;

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(C) salaries for local government employees;

8 (D) moving expenses for employees of the businesses locating within 9 the STAR bond project district;

(E) property taxes for businesses that locate in the STAR bond project
 district;

12 (F) lobbying costs;

(G) any bond origination fee charged by the city or county;

14 (H) any personal property as defined in K.S.A. 79-102, and 15 amendments thereto; and

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(I) travel, entertainment and hospitality.

17 $\frac{(s)(t)}{(s)}$ "Projected market area" means any area within the state in 18 which the project is projected to have a substantial fiscal or market impact 19 upon businesses in such area.

20 (t)(u) "River walk canal facilities" means a canal and related water 21 features which flow through a major commercial entertainment and 22 tourism area and facilities related or contiguous thereto, including, but not 23 limited to, pedestrian walkways and promenades, landscaping and parking 24 facilities.

(v) "Rural redevelopment project" means a project that is in an area
outside of a city with a population of more than 50,000, that is of regional
importance, with capital investment of at least \$3,000,000 and that will
enhance the quality of life in the community and region.

(u)(w) "Sales tax and revenue" are those revenues available to finance
 the issuance of special obligation bonds as identified in K.S.A. 2020 Supp.
 12-17,168, and amendments thereto.

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 $(\mathbf{v})(\mathbf{x})$ "STAR bond" means a sales tax and revenue bond.

33 (w)(y) "STAR bond project" means an approved project to implement 34 a project plan for the development of the established STAR bond project 35 district with that:

36 (1) (A) Has at least a \$50,000,000 \$75,000,000 capital investment
 37 and \$50,000,000 \$75,000,000 in projected gross annual sales; or

38 (B) for metropolitan areas with a population of between 50,000 and 39 75,000, has at least a \$40,000,000 capital investment and \$40,000,000 in 40 projected gross annual sales, if the project is deemed of high value by the 41 secretary; or

42 (2) for areas outside of metropolitan statistical areas, as defined by 43 the federal office of management and budget, the secretary finds *the* 1 project:

2 (A) The project Is an eligible area as defined in subsection (f), and 3 amendments thereto; and

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(B) would be of regional or statewide importance; or

5 (3) is a major tourism area as defined in subsection-(1), and-6 amendments thereto (m); or

7 is a major motorsports complex, as defined in subsection (k) (1); (4) 8 or9

(5) is a rural redevelopment project as defined in subsection (v).

"STAR bond project area" means the geographic area within 10 $(\mathbf{x})(z)$ the STAR bond project district in which there may be one or more 11 12 projects.

"STAR bond project district" means the specific area declared 13 (y)(aa) 14 to be an eligible area as determined by the secretary in which the city or county may develop one or more STAR bond projects. A "STAR bond 15 16 project district" includes a redevelopment district, as defined in K.S.A. 12-17 1770a, and amendments thereto, created prior to the effective date of this act for the Wichita Waterwalk project in Wichita, Kansas, provided, the 18 19 city creating such redevelopment district submits an application for 20 approval for STAR bond financing to the secretary on or before July 31, 21 2007, and receives a final letter of determination from the secretary 22 approving or disapproving the request for STAR bond financing on or 23 before November 1, 2007. No STAR bond project district shall include 24 real property which has been part of another STAR bond project district 25 unless such STAR bond project and STAR bond project district have been 26 approved by the secretary of commerce pursuant to K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-27 17,164 and 12-17,165, and amendments thereto, prior to March 1, 2016. A 28 STAR bond project district in a metropolitan statistical area, as defined by 29 the federal office of management and budget, shall be a contiguous parcel 30 of real estate and shall be limited to those areas being developed by the 31 STAR bond project and any area of real property reasonably anticipated to 32 directly benefit from the redevelopment project.

33 (z)(bb) "STAR bond project district plan" means the preliminary plan 34 that identifies all of the proposed STAR bond project areas and identifies in a general manner all of the buildings, facilities and improvements in 35 36 each that are proposed to be constructed or improved in each STAR bond 37 project area.

38 "STAR bond project plan" means the plan adopted by a city (aa)(cc) 39 or county for the development of a STAR bond project or projects in a 40 STAR bond project district.

41 "Secretary" means the secretary of commerce. (bb)(dd)

42 "Substantial change" means, as applicable, a change wherein (cc)(ee) 43 the proposed plan or plans differ substantially from the intended purpose

1 for which the STAR bond project district plan was approved.

2 (dd)(ff) "Tax increment" means that portion of the revenue derived 3 from state and local sales, use and transient guest tax imposed pursuant to K.S.A. 12-187 et seq., 12-1692 et seq., 79-3601 et seq. and 79-3701 et 4 5 seq., and amendments thereto, collected from taxpayers doing business 6 within that portion of a STAR bond project district occupied by a project 7 that is in excess of the amount of base year revenue. For purposes of this 8 subsection, the base year shall be the 12-month period immediately prior 9 to the month in which the STAR bond project district is established. The 10 department of revenue shall determine base year revenue by reference to the revenue collected during the base year from taxpayers doing business 11 within the specific area in which a STAR bond project district is 12 13 subsequently established. The base year of a STAR bond project district, 14 following the addition of area to the STAR bond project district, shall be the base year for the original area, and with respect to the additional area, 15 16 the base year shall be any 12-month period immediately prior to the month 17 in which additional area is added to the STAR bond project district. For 18 purposes of this subsection, revenue collected from taxpayers doing 19 business within a STAR bond project district, or within a specific area in 20 which a STAR bond project district is subsequently established shall not 21 include local sales and use tax revenue that is sourced to jurisdictions other 22 than those in which the project is located. The secretary of revenue and the 23 secretary of commerce shall certify the appropriate amount of base vear 24 revenue for taxpayers relocating from within the state into a STAR bond 25 district.

(ee)(gg) "Taxpayer" means a person, corporation, limited liability
 company, S corporation, partnership, registered limited liability
 partnership, foundation, association, nonprofit entity, sole proprietorship,
 business trust, group or other entity that is subject to the Kansas income
 tax act, K.S.A. 79-3201 et seq., and amendments thereto.

Sec. 3. K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,165 is hereby amended to read as follows: 12-17,165. (a) When a city or county proposes to establish a STAR bond project district, within an eligible area, the city or county shall adopt a resolution stating that the city or county is considering the establishment of a STAR bond project district. Such resolution shall:

36 (1) Give notice that a public hearing will be held to consider the 37 establishment of a STAR bond project district and fix the date, hour and 38 place of such public hearing;

39 (2) describe the proposed boundaries of the STAR bond project40 district;

(3) describe the STAR bond project district plan;

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42 (4) state that a description and map of the proposed STAR bond 43 project district are available for inspection at a time and place designated; 1 (5) provide a description of all state, federal and local tax incentives 2 that apply or, pursuant to the STAR bond project district plan, are 3 anticipated to apply within the STAR bond district or that apply to any 4 business located in or, as provided in the public STAR bond project district 5 plan or in any other public document, that will locate in the district; and

6 (5)(6) state that the governing body will consider findings necessary
7 for the establishment of a STAR bond project district.

Notice shall be given as prescribed in K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,166(f) (2), and amendments thereto, and, if the county or city has a website, notice shall be conspicuously provided at a prominent location on the first page of the website of the county or city. Such notice shall include the items described in subsections (a)(2), (a)(3), (a)(4) and (a)(5) and any other document or information required to be set forth in the resolution or a link to such items.

(b) The city or county shall submit the proposed STAR bond project
 district to the secretary for a determination that the district is an eligible
 area as defined in K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,162, and amendments thereto.

18 (c) Upon the conclusion of the public hearing, and a finding by the 19 secretary that the proposed project district is an eligible area, the 20 governing body of the municipality shall pass an ordinance or resolution. 21 The ordinance or resolution, including the STAR bond project district 22 plan, the legal description of the STAR bond project district and any other 23 public documents considered at the public hearing, shall be conspicuously 24 posted or linked to a prominent location on the first page of the city or 25 county's website, if the city or county has a website.

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(1) An ordinance or resolution for a STAR bond project district shall:

(A) Make findings that the STAR bond project district proposed to be
developed is an historic theater, or a STAR bond project as defined in
K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,162, and amendments thereto;

(B) contain a STAR bond project district plan that identifies all of the
proposed STAR bond project areas and identifies in a general manner all
of the buildings and facilities that are proposed to be constructed or
improved in each STAR bond project area. The boundaries of such STAR
bond project district shall not include any area not designated in the notice
required by subsection (a);

36 (C) provide a description of all state, federal and local tax incentives 37 that apply or, pursuant to the STAR bond project district plan, are 38 anticipated to apply within the STAR bond district or that apply to any 39 business located in or, as provided in the public STAR bond project district 40 plan or in any other public document, that will locate in the district; and

41 (C)(D) contain the legal description of the STAR bond project district 42 and may establish the STAR bond project district.

43 (2) If no ordinance or resolution is passed by the city or county within

30 days from the conclusion of the public hearing, then such STAR bond
 project district shall not be established.

3 (d) The governing body of a city or county may establish a STAR bond project district within that city or such city may establish a district 4 inclusive of land outside the boundaries of the city or wholly outside the 5 6 boundaries of such city upon written consent of the board of county 7 commissioners. Prior to providing written consent, the board of county 8 commissioners must provide notice and hold a hearing as is required of a city pursuant to subsection (a) for the establishment of a STAR bond 9 10 project district.

The governing body of a county may establish a STAR bond projectdistrict within the unincorporated area of the county.

(e) One or more STAR bond projects may be undertaken by a city or
 county within a STAR bond project district after such STAR bond project
 district has been established in the manner provided by this section.

16 (f) No privately owned property subject to ad valorem taxes shall be 17 acquired and redeveloped under the provisions of K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-18 17,160 et seq., and amendments thereto, if the board of county 19 commissioners or the board of education levving taxes on such property 20 determines by resolution adopted within 30 days following the conclusion 21 of the hearing for the establishment of the STAR bond project district 22 required by subsection (a) that the proposed STAR bond project district 23 will have an adverse effect on such county or school district. The board of 24 county commissioners or board of education shall deliver a copy of such 25 resolution to the city or county. The city or county shall within 30 days of receipt of such resolution pass an ordinance or resolution dissolving the 26 27 STAR bond project district. The provisions of this subsection shall not 28 apply if the STAR bond project plan provides that ad valorem property tax 29 revenues of the county or the school district levying taxes on such property 30 will not be adversely impacted.

(g) A STAR bond project shall not include a project for a gamblingcasino.

(h) No new STAR bond project district may be established from the
effective date of this act through July 1, 2018, except that, for STAR bond
project districts established prior to the effective date of this act, the
foregoing shall not prohibit a city or county from utilizing all provisions of
the STAR bonds financing act, including, but not limited to, K.S.A. 2020
Supp. 12-17,171, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 4. K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,166 is hereby amended to read as follows: 12-17,166. (a) One or more projects may be undertaken by a city or county within an established STAR bond project district *upon submission of the project plan to the secretary of commerce and approval by the secretary as provided by K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,164, and* amendments thereto. Any city or county proposing to undertake a STAR
 bond project, shall prepare a STAR bond project plan in consultation with
 the planning commission of the city, and in consultation with the planning
 commission of the county, if any, if such project is located wholly outside
 the boundaries of the city. Any such project plan may be implemented in
 separate development stages.

7 (b) Any city or county proposing to undertake a STAR bond project 8 within a STAR bond project district established pursuant to K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,165, and amendments thereto, shall prepare a feasibility study 9 10 to be conducted by one or more consultants selected and approved by the secretary, and the costs shall be paid by the developer or the city or 11 12 county. The secretary shall have control and oversight authority over the scope, conduct and methodology of the study. The secretary may establish 13 a list of preapproved consultants and approved study parameters and 14 15 *methods*. The feasibility study shall contain the following:

(1) Whether a STAR bond project's revenue and tax increment
revenue and other available revenues under K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,169,
and amendments thereto, are expected to exceed or be sufficient to pay for
the project costs;

(2) the effect, if any, a STAR bond project will have on any
outstanding special obligation bonds payable from the revenues described
in K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,169, and amendments thereto;

(3) a statement of how the jobs and taxes obtained from the STAR
bond project will contribute significantly to the economic development of
the state and region;

26 (4) visitation expectations and a plan describing how the number of 27 visitors to the STAR bond project district will be tracked and reported to 28 the secretary on an annual basis. Such plan shall include, but not be 29 limited to, obtaining and reporting visitor residence zip code data to the secretary. All businesses located in the STAR bond district shall provide 30 31 visitor residence data requested by the secretary. Any such data shall be provided in an aggregate manner without personally identifiable 32 33 information;

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(5) the unique quality of the project;

35 (6) economic impact study, *including the anticipated effect of the* 36 *project on the regional and statewide economies*;

- 37 (7) market study;
- 38 (8) market impact study;

39 (9) integration and collaboration with other resources or businesses;

40 (10) the quality of service and experience provided, as measured 41 against national consumer standards for the specific target market;

42 (11) project accountability, measured according to best industry 43 practices; 1 (12) the expected return on state and local investment that the project 2 is anticipated to produce;

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(13) a net return on investment analysis;

4 (14) a statement concerning whether a portion of the local sales and 5 use taxes are pledged to other uses and are unavailable as revenue for the 6 STAR bond project. If a portion of local sales and use taxes is so 7 committed, the applicant shall describe the following:

8 (A) The percentage of city and county sales and use taxes collected 9 that are so committed; and

(B) the date or dates on which the city and county sales and use taxes
 pledged to other uses can be pledged for repayment of bonds; and

12 (14)(15) an anticipated principal and interest payment schedule on the 13 bond issue;

(16) a summary of community involvement, participation and support
 for the STAR bond project; and

(17) a full disclosure and description of all state, federal and local
tax incentives that apply or, pursuant to the project plan, are anticipated to
apply within the STAR bond district or that apply to any business located
in or, pursuant to the project plan, that will locate in the district.

The failure to include all information enumerated in this subsection in the feasibility study for a STAR bond project shall not affect the validity of bonds issued pursuant to this act.

(c) If the city or county determines the project is feasible, the projectplan shall include:

(1) A summary of the feasibility study done as defined in subsection
(b) of this section, and amendments thereto;

(2) a reference to the district plan established under K.S.A. 2020
Supp. 12-17,165, and amendments thereto, that identifies the project area
that is set forth in the project plan that is being considered;

(3) a description and map of the project area to be redeveloped;

(4) the relocation assistance plan as described in K.S.A. 2020 Supp.
12-17,172, and amendments thereto;

(5) a detailed description of the buildings and facilities proposed to be
 constructed or improved in such area; and

(6) the names of the owners, partners, officers or principals of any
developer of the project and of any associated business partner of any
developer of the project that is involved in the STAR bond project; and

38 (6)(7) any other information the governing body of the city or county
 39 deems necessary to advise the public of the intent of the project plan.

(d) A copy of the STAR bond project plan prepared by a city shall be
delivered to the board of county commissioners of the county and the
board of education of any school district levying taxes on property within
the STAR bond project area. A copy of the STAR bond project plan

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prepared by a county shall be delivered to the board of education of any
 school district levying taxes on property within the STAR bond project
 area.

4 (e) Upon a finding by the planning commission that the STAR bond 5 project plan is consistent with the intent of the comprehensive plan for the 6 development of the city, and a finding by the planning commission of the 7 county, if any, with respect to a STAR bond project located wholly outside 8 the boundaries of the city, that the STAR bond project plan is consistent with the intent of the comprehensive plan for the development of the 9 county, the governing body of the city or county shall adopt a resolution 10 stating that the city or county is considering the adoption of the STAR 11 12 bond project plan. Such resolution shall:

13 (1) Give notice that a public hearing will be held to consider the 14 adoption of the STAR bond project plan and fix the date, hour and place of 15 such public hearing. *In addition to any other notice, such notice shall be* 16 *conspicuously provided at a prominent location on the first page of the* 17 *website of the county or city, if the county or city has a website;*

(2) describe the boundaries of the STAR bond project district within
which the STAR bond project will be located and the date of establishment
of such district;

(3) describe the boundaries of the area proposed to be included withinthe STAR bond project area; and

(4) state that the STAR bond project plan, including a summary of the
feasibility study, market study, relocation assistance plan and financial
guarantees of the prospective developer and a description and map of the
area to be redeveloped or developed are available for inspection during
regular office hours in the office of the city clerk or county clerk,
respectively.

(f) (1) The date fixed for the public hearing to consider the adoption
of the STAR bond project plan shall be not less than 30 nor more than 70
days following the date of the adoption of the resolution fixing the date of
the hearing.

33 (2) A copy of the city or county resolution providing for the public 34 hearing shall be by certified mail, return receipt requested, sent by the city 35 to the board of county commissioners of the county and by the city or 36 county to the board of education of any school district levying taxes on 37 property within the proposed STAR bond project area. Copies also shall be 38 sent by certified mail, return receipt requested to each owner and occupant 39 of land within the proposed STAR bond project area not more than 10 days 40 following the date of the adoption of the resolution. The resolution shall be published once in the official city or county newspaper not less than one 41 42 week nor more than two weeks preceding the date fixed for the public 43 hearing. A sketch clearly delineating the area in sufficient detail to advise

the reader of the particular land proposed to be included within the STAR
 bond project area shall be published with the resolution.

3 (3) At the public hearing, a representative of the city or county shall 4 present the city's or county's proposed STAR bond project plan. The 5 presentation shall include a discussion of the feasibility study, including a 6 description of all state, federal and local tax incentives that apply within 7 the STAR bond district or are anticipated to apply within the district 8 pursuant to the project plan or to any business located in the district or that will locate in the district pursuant to the project plan. Following the 9 presentation of the STAR bond project area, all interested persons shall be 10 given an opportunity to be heard. The governing body for good cause 11 12 shown may recess such hearing to a time and date certain, which shall be 13 fixed in the presence of persons in attendance at the hearing.

14 (g) The public hearing records and feasibility study shall be subject to 15 the open records act, K.S.A. 45-215, and amendments thereto, *and, if the* 16 *city or county has a website, shall be placed conspicuously on such* 17 *website at the same location or linked to the same location on the first* 18 *page of the website as the notice for the hearing.*

(h) Upon conclusion of the public hearing, the governing body may
adopt the STAR bond project plan by ordinance or resolution passed upon
a two-thirds vote of the members.

22 (i) After the adoption by the city or county governing body of a 23 STAR bond project plan, the clerk of the city or county shall transmit a copy of the description of the land within the STAR bond project district, a 24 25 copy of the ordinance or resolution adopting the plan and a map or plat 26 indicating the boundaries of the district to the clerk, appraiser and treasurer 27 of the county in which the district is located and to the governing bodies of 28 the county and school district which levy taxes upon any property in the district. (j) If the STAR bond project plan is approved, the feasibility study shall be supplemented to include a copy of the minutes of the governing body meetings of any city or county whose bonding authority will be utilized in the STAR bond project, evidencing that a STAR bond project plan has been created, discussed and adopted by the city or county in a regularly scheduled open public meeting.

(k) Any substantial changes as defined in K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 1217,162, and amendments thereto, to the STAR bond project plan as
adopted shall be subject to a public hearing following publication of notice
thereof at least twice in the official city or county newspaper.

42 (1) Any STAR bond project shall be completed within 20 years from43 the date of the approval of the STAR bond project plan. The maximum

maturity on bonds issued to finance projects pursuant to this act shall not
 exceed 20 years.

3 (m) Kansas resident employees shall be given priority consideration 4 for employment in construction projects located in a STAR bond project 5 area.

6 (n) Any developer of a STAR bond project shall commence work on 7 the project within two years from the date of adoption of the STAR bond 8 project plan. Should the developer fail to commence work on the STAR bond project within the two-year period, funding for such project shall 9 cease and the developer of such project or complex shall have one year to 10 resubmit the project to the secretary and to appeal to the secretary for 11 12 reapproval of such project and the funding for it. Should the project be 13 reapproved, the two-year period for commencement shall apply.

Sec. 5. K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,169 is hereby amended to read as 14 follows: 12-17,169. (a) (1) Any city or county shall have the power to 15 16 issue special obligation bonds in one or more series to finance the 17 undertaking of any STAR bond project in accordance with the provisions of this act. (D) at the option of the county in a city STAR bond project district, from a pledge of all of the tax increment revenues received by the county from any local sales and use taxes which are collected from taxpayers doing business within that portion of the city's STAR bond project district established pursuant to K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,165, and amendments thereto, except for amounts committed to other uses by election of voters or pledged to bond repayment prior to the approval of a STAR bond 1 project;

2 (E) in a county STAR bond project district, from a pledge of 100% of 3 the tax increment revenue received by the county from any county sales 4 and use tax, but excluding any portions of such taxes that are allocated to the cities in such county pursuant to K.S.A. 12-192, and amendments 5 6 thereto, which are collected from taxpayers doing business within that 7 portion of the county's STAR bond project district established pursuant to 8 K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,165, and amendments thereto, occupied by a 9 STAR bond project;

10 (F) from a pledge of all or a portion of the tax increment revenue received from any state sales taxes which are collected from taxpayers 11 12 doing business within that portion of the city's or county's STAR bond 13 project district occupied by a STAR bond project, except that for any 14 STAR bond project district established and approved by the secretary on or after January 1, 2017, such tax increment shall not include any sales tax 15 16 revenue from retail automobile dealers, and except that for any STAR bond project district established after July 1, 2021, with existing sales tax 17 18 revenue at the time the district was established, such pledge shall not 19 exceed 90% of the new tax increment revenue that is in excess of the base 20 existing sales tax revenue received from any state sales taxes;

21 (G) at the option of the city or county and with approval of the 22 secretary, from all or a portion of the transient guest tax of such city or 23 county;

(H) at the option of the city or county and with approval of the secretary: (i) From a pledge of all or a portion of increased revenue received by the city or county from franchise fees collected from utilities and other businesses using public right-of-way within the STAR bond project district; or (ii) from a pledge of all or a portion of the revenue received by a city or county from local sales taxes or local transient guest and local use taxes; or

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(I) by any combination of these methods.

The city or county may pledge such revenue to the repayment of such special obligation bonds prior to, simultaneously with, or subsequent to the issuance of such special obligation bonds.

35 (2) Bonds issued under subsection (a)(1) shall not be general 36 obligations of the city or the county, nor in any event shall they give rise to 37 a charge against its general credit or taxing powers, or be payable out of 38 any funds or properties other than any of those set forth in subsection (a) 39 (1) and such bonds shall so state on their face.

40 (3) Bonds issued under the provisions of subsection (a)(1) shall be 41 special obligations of the city or county and are declared to be negotiable 42 instruments. Such bonds shall be executed by the mayor and clerk of the 43 city or the chairperson of the board of county commissioners and the county clerk and sealed with the corporate seal of the city or county. All
 details pertaining to the issuance of such special obligation bonds and

The governing body may issue the bonds 38 unless within 60 days following the conclusion of the public hearing on 39 the proposed STAR bond project plan a protest petition signed by 3% of 40 the qualified voters of the city is filed with the city clerk in accordance 41 with the provisions of K.S.A. 25-3601 et seq., and amendments thereto. If 42 a sufficient petition is filed, no full faith and credit tax increment bonds 43 shall be issued until the issuance of the bonds is approved by a majority of 1 the voters voting at an election thereon. Such election shall be called and 2 held in the manner provided by the general bond law. The failure of the 3 voters to approve the issuance of full faith and credit tax increment bonds 4 shall not prevent the city from issuing special obligation bonds in 5 accordance with this section. No such election shall be held in the event 6 the board of county commissioners or the board of education determines, 7 as provided in K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,165, and amendments thereto, that 8 the proposed STAR bond project district will have an adverse effect on the 9 county or school district.

10 (3) As an alternative to subsection (b)(2), any city which adopts a STAR bond project plan for a major motorsports complex, but does not 11 12 state its intent to issue full faith and credit tax increment bonds in the resolution required by K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,166(e), and amendments 13 thereto, and has not acquired property in the STAR bond project area may 14 issue full faith and credit tax increment bonds if the governing body of the 15 16 city adopts a resolution stating its intent to issue the bonds and the 17 issuance of the bonds is approved by a majority of the voters voting at an 18 election thereon. Such election shall be called and held in the manner 19 provided by the general bond law. The failure of the voters to approve the 20 issuance of full faith and credit tax increment bonds shall not prevent the 21 city from issuing special obligation bonds pursuant to subsection (a)(1). 22 Any project plan adopted by a city prior to the effective date of this act in 23 accordance with K.S.A. 12-1772, and amendments thereto, shall not be 24 invalidated by any requirements of this act.

25 (4) During the progress of any major motorsports complex project in which the project costs will be financed, in whole or in part, with the 26 27 proceeds of full faith and credit tax increment bonds, the city may issue 28 temporary notes in the manner provided in K.S.A. 10-123, and 29 amendments thereto, to pay the project costs for the major motorsports 30 complex project. Such temporary notes shall not be issued and the city 31 shall not acquire property in the STAR bond project area until the 32 requirements of subsection (b)(2) or (b)(3), whichever is applicable, have 33 been met

34 (5) Full faith and credit tax increment bonds issued under this 35 subsection shall be general obligations of the city and are declared to be 36 negotiable instruments. Such bonds shall be issued in accordance with the 37 general bond law. All such bonds and all income or interest therefrom shall 38 be exempt from all state taxes. The amount of the full faith and credit tax 39 increment bonds issued and outstanding which exceeds 3% of the assessed 40 valuation of the city shall be within the bonded debt limit applicable to 41 such city.

42 (6) Any city issuing full faith and credit tax increment bonds under 43 the provisions of this subsection may refund all or part of such issue 1 pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 10-116a, and amendments thereto.

2 (c) (1) For each project financed with special obligation bonds 3 payable from the revenues described in subsection (a)(1), the city or 4 county shall prepare and submit to the secretary by October 1 of each year, 5 a report describing the status of any projects within such STAR bond 6 project area, any expenditures of the proceeds of special obligation bonds 7 that have occurred since the last annual report and any expenditures of the proceeds of such bonds expected to occur in the future, including the 8 9 amount of sales tax revenue, how such revenue has been spent, the 10 projected amount of such revenue-and, the anticipated use of such revenue and the names of the owners, partners, officers or principals of any 11 developer and of any associated business partners of any developer that 12 13 are involved in the STAR bond project. The department of commerce shall 14 compile this information and submit a report annually to the governor and 15 the legislature by February 1 of each year.

16 (2) (A) In addition to the report referenced in paragraph (1), the 17 department of commerce, in cooperation with the department of revenue, 18 shall submit a report to the senate commerce committee and the house 19 commerce, labor and economic development committee by January 31 of 20 each session. The report shall include the following information for the last 21 three calendar years and the most current year-to-date information 22 available with respect to each STAR bond district:

(i) The gross annual sales, gross annual sales projected pursuant to
the STAR bond project plan and feasibility study, gross annual sales

(vii) the percentage of local effort sales tax actually committed to the
district compared to the state's share of sales tax percentage committed to
the district;

42 (viii) the number of out-of-state visitors to a project *and description* 43 *of the data gathered pursuant to the visitor tracking plan, including, but* 1 not limited to, residence zip code data, a discussion of the visitor attraction 2 properties of projects in the districts, and a comparison of the number of 3 out-of-state visitors with the number of in-state visitors; and

4 (ix) if any information or data is not available, an explanation as to 5 why it is not available.

6 (B) Either the senate commerce committee or the house committee on 7 commerce, labor and economic development may amend the information 8 required in the report with additional requests and clarification on a going 9 forward basis.

10 (3) Cities, counties and developers shall provide all information requested by the secretary for the secretary's database as provided by 11 K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 74-50,227, and amendments thereto. If the city or 12 13 county has a website, a conspicuous link directly to the information 14 pertaining to the city or county's STAR bond project on the secretary's 15 database shall be placed on the city's or county's website. A separate link 16 shall be provided for each STAR bond project of the city or county.

17 (d) The reports pursuant to subsection (c)(1) and (2) shall include a description of all state, federal and local tax incentives that apply within 18 19 the STAR bond district or to any business located in the district.

20 (e) A city or county may use the proceeds of special obligation bonds 21 or any uncommitted funds derived from sources set forth in this section to 22 pay the bond project costs as defined in K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,162, and 23 amendments thereto, to implement the STAR bond project plan.

24 (e)(f) With respect to a STAR bond project district established prior to 25 January 1, 2003, for which, prior to January 1, 2003, the secretary made a finding as provided in subsection (a) that a STAR bond project would 26 27 create a major tourism area for the state, such special obligation bonds 28 shall be payable both as to principal and interest, from a pledge of all of 29 the revenue from any transient guest, state and local sales and use taxes 30 collected from taxpayers as provided in subsection (a) whether or not 31 revenues from such taxes are received by the city.

22 (e) Removal of real property from one STAR bond project district 23 and addition of all or a portion of that real property to another STAR bond 24 project district may be accomplished by the adoption of an ordinance or 25 resolution, and in such event the determination of the existence or 26 nonexistence of an adverse effect on the county or school district under 27 K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,165(f), and amendments thereto, shall apply to 28 both such removal and such addition of real property to a STAR bond 29 project district.

30 (f) The transfer of any ownership interest in real property acquired 31 with the proceeds from STAR bonds shall require the advance approval of 32 the secretary. While such STAR bonds remain outstanding, such transfer 33 shall also require the disclosure of the sale price and the name of any 34 transferee and any individual owner, partner, officer or principal of such 35 transferee. The information shall be included in the secretary's reports 36 pursuant to K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 12-17,169(c)(1) and (2), and amendments 37 thereto.
