1 AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for fiscal years ending
2 June 30, 2021, June 30, 2022, June 30, 2023, and June 30, 2024, for
3 state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, capital improvement
4 projects and fees, imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and
5 directing or authorizing certain receipts, disbursements, procedures and
6 acts incidental to the foregoing; amending K.S.A. 75-6702 and 75-6706
7 and K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 2-223, 12-1775a, 12-5256, 55-193, 72-5462,
8 74-50,107, 74-99b34, 75-2263, 75-6707, 76-775, 76-7,107, 79-2959,
9 79-2964, 79-3425i, 79-34,171, 79-4804 and 82a-953a and repealing the
10 existing sections.

12 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2021, June 30,
14 2022, June 30, 2023, and June 30, 2024, appropriations are hereby made,
15 restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, capital
16 improvement projects, fees, receipts, disbursements and acts incidental
17 to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.

(b) The agencies named in this act are hereby authorized to initiate
19 and complete the capital improvement projects specified and authorized by
20 this act or for which appropriations are made by this act, subject to the
21 restrictions and limitations imposed by this act.

(c) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 75-
23 6702(a), and amendments thereto.

(d) The appropriations made by this act shall not be subject to the
25 provisions of K.S.A. 46-155, and amendments thereto.

16 made by any state agency that is named in this act and that is not otherwise
17 authorized by law to apply for and receive federal grants, expenditures
18 may be made by such state agency from moneys appropriated for fiscal

20 session of the legislature to apply for and receive federal grants during
21 fiscal year 2022, which federal grants are hereby authorized to be applied
22 for and received by such state agencies: *Provided*, That no expenditure
23 shall be made from and no obligation shall be incurred against any such
24 federal grant or other federal receipt that has not been previously
25 appropriated or reappropriated or approved for expenditure by the
26 governor, until the governor has authorized the state agency to make
27 expenditures therefrom.

28 (c) During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, the provisions of this
29 section shall not apply to any federal grant or other federal receipt received
30 by the state of Kansas for aid for conronavirus relief. Such moneys are
31 subject to the provisions of section 30(c).
