SUPPLEMENTAL NOTE ON HOUSE BILL NO. 2367

As Recommended by House Committee on Energy, Utilities and Telecommunications

Brief*

HB 2367 would amend law to clarify the Kansas Corporation Commission (KCC) has authority to regulate the activities or facilities of an otherwise jurisdictional entity with regard to wire stringing.

Background

The bill was introduced by the House Committee on Energy, Utilities and Telecommunications.

House Committee on Energy, Utilities and Telecommunications

In the House Committee hearing, **proponent** testimony was provided by representatives of KCC and Pioneer Electric, who stated the bill would improve public safety by requiring owners of generator lead lines that connect power from private generation facilities to the transmission grid to design and construct transmission lines in accordance with national safety standards.

Neutral testimony was provided by a representative of the Kansas Advanced Power Alliance, who noted the bill would give KCC a role in regulating certain transmission lines that are not part of the Southwest Power Pool's transmission system.
