HB 2551 Conference Committee Recommendations

The **Conference Committee** concurs with the House and Senate Committee of the Whole recommendations for FY 2025 with the following adjustments:

- 1. Add \$750,000 SGF for a constituent relationship management software system for all statewide elected officials in FY 2025.
- Transfer \$4.0 million from the Legislative Employment Security Fund to the Legislative Coordinating Council to ensure access to natural gas supplies in rural communities for FY 2025.
- 3. Transfer \$10.0 million from the Legislative Employment Security Fund to the Department of Commerce for World Cup for FY 2025.
- 4. Add \$29,414 SGF, for a salary adjustment for most state employees based on the Department of Administration Market Survey and a 5.0 percent salary adjustment for employees with job classifications that are not included in the Market Survey for FY 2025. This adjustment includes increasing minimum pay to \$15.03 per hour.
- 5. Partially veto, language for a constituent relationship management software system for all statewide elected officials in FY 2025. The veto eliminates the participation of the Legislative Coordinating Council from the procurement process.
