



#### and Support of ESU Efficiency **Kansas Initiatives**

#### Efficiencies

- Only 7.9% of ESU budget allocated to administration
- Compares to 11% at public institutions in a 5 state region
- Reduced natural gas consumption by 4.3%
- Reduced electric consumption 1.2%
- Reduced utility expenditures by \$175,000 through Particularly significant given weather extremes of recent year
- Multiple examples of collaboration with state universities and community colleges




