AN ACT concerning inheritance rights; relating to revocation upon divorce.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) As used in this section:

"Disposition or appointment of property" includes a transfer of an item of property or any other benefit to a beneficiary designated in a governing instrument.
 "Divorce or annulment" means any divorce or annulment, or any dissolution or declaration of invalidity of a marriage that would exclude dissolution or declaration of invalidity of a marriage.

(2) "Divorce or annulment" means any divorce or annulment, or any dissolution or declaration of invalidity of a marriage, that would exclude the spouse as a surviving spouse. A decree of separation that does not terminate the status of husband and wife is not a divorce for purposes of this section.

(3) "Divorced individual" includes an individual whose marriage has been annulled.

(4) "Governing instrument" means a document executed by the divorced individual before the divorce or annulment of such individual's marriage to such individual's former spouse.

(5) "Relative of the divorced individual's former spouse" means an individual who is related to the divorced individual's former spouse by blood, adoption or affinity and who, after the divorce or annulment, is not related to the divorced individual by blood, adoption or affinity.

(6) "Revocable," with respect to a disposition, appointment, provision or nomination, means one under which the divorced individual, at the time of the divorce or annulment, was alone empowered, by law or under the governing instrument, to cancel the designation in favor of such individual's former spouse or former spouse's relative, whether or not the divorced individual was then empowered to designate such individual's self in place of such individual's former spouse's relative and whether or not the divorced individual then had the capacity to exercise the power.

"Surviving spouse" does not include an individual who:

(A) Is divorced from the decedent or whose marriage to the decedent has been annulled unless, by virtue of a subsequent marriage, such individual is married to the decedent at the time of death. A decree of separation that does not terminate the status of husband and wife is not a
